# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Although we have had an extremely disruptive year in regard to COVID and a period of learning from home, school attendance is still the key factor in student achievement of quality academic, socio-economic and health outcomes. The research shows us that students with an attendance rate below 90% are educationally at risk.

Currently, our data indicates that we have approximately 58% of students attending at a rate greater than 90%. This statistic includes 100% attendance during the time students were learning from home. Clearly, as a school community, we need to improve the overall attendance rate of nearly half of our students. Our 58% needs to be closer or above the state average of 75%.

Most of our students are attending at a rate greater than 80% and we can easily shift our overall attendance if we exclude some of the "soft" absences. One day at home can have a huge impact on the continuity of learning and all absences should be accompanied by a clear, unavoidable reason such as illness or leave approved by the Principal. Students engaging in paid employment, harvest work and avoidable activities cannot be approved by the Principal.

I hope all of our parents/carers know the attendance rates of their children. An easy way to check your child's attendance rate is via the SENTRAL Parent Portal. You can view all absences and if you have any unexplained absences, this can be updated within the portal.

We want all parents to use this communication channel so we can share details about day/class attendance, literacy and numeracy targets, school surveys and other important correspondence. If you are unsure on how to access the parent portal, please phone the school and one of our helpful staff will assist.

We have six weeks left in the year and I would like to encourage all parents to at least view the details within the parent portal, ask our staff questions and ensure your child has a very good reason when they miss any school days.

There are other features of the portal that allows parents and students access to NAPLAN results, school report comments and attendance data, all of which allow students to take ownership of their progress and learning as well as allow parents to be able to monitor their child's progress. WWHS reports are also distributed and accessed through the portal.

### **Parent and Student Sentral Portal instructions**

This Quick reference guide can be used for both parents and students.

### First time use and new user registration

The steps to access the Parent and Student Portal are:

- 1. All parents and caregivers, are emailed their Parent and Student Portal letters with their unique Access Key. If you do not have one contact the school.
- 2. Use Google Chrome to access the portal as some other browsers may not work as well.
- 3. Register for an account on the registration page
  - Enter in your username. This must be your current email address. Students are required to use their DEC username eg. jane.smith
  - Create a secure password. Note This is not where you put in the Access Key.

You will now be taken to another screen

Enter in the Access Key from your letter

Lunchtime sessions are 1hr and 15mins. Evening sessions are 1hr and 15mins with a


