YEAR 7 STEM CHALLENGE EXCURSION



The WWHS Student and Parent Portal is one site where students can log into and access all of the above through clicking on the relevant links.

There are other features of the Portal that allow parents and students access to NAPLAN results, school

report comments and attendance data, all of which allow students to take ownership of their progress and learning as well as allow parents to be able to monitor their child's progress. WWHS reports are also distributed and accessed through the Portal.

Parent and student SENTRAL Portal instructions

This Quick reference guide can be used for both parents and students.

First time use and new user registration

The steps to access the Parent and student Portal are:

- All parents and caregivers, are emailed their Parent and student Portal letters with their unique access key. If you do not have one contact the school.
- Use Google Chrome to access the portal as some other browsers may not work as well.
- 3. Register for an account on the registration page
 - Enter in your username. This must be your current email address.
 - b. Create a secure password. Note This is not where you put in the access key

You will now be taken to another screen.

- 1. Enter in the Access key from your letter
- SUCCESS! You now have access to the WWHS Parent and Student Portal.



The Australian Securities and Investments Commission has introduced new regulations regarding the sale of add-on insurance products. These regulations now require a 4 day 'pause' between the purchase of a device and any add-on insurance associated with that device.
